The student debt and wage stagnation are at an all-time high. The Federal Reserve estimates that national student loan debt reached \$1.67 trillion in June 2020. St. Louis Community College (STLCC) provides students with affordable educational options, but 49% of students apply for financial assistance. STLCC provided \$30 million in financial aid in 2019, yet the unmet need remains significant.

Current Unmet Student Assistance Need

- \$40 million of unmet financial need
- \$5,159 average unmet need per financial aid applicant
- 12-15% students in need of food assistance
- 185 students are considered homeless

St. Louis Community College seeks to improve student persistence, retention, graduation and placement rates by investing in student support programs and reducing the financial burden for students. We help our students through graduation and beyond by strengthening our key student services and community partnerships that help students stay in school and develop clear pathways to regional employers.
