It Pays to Be an A+ Student

The state of Missouri allows qualifying graduates from designated A+ high schools the opportunity to receive **free maintenance fees** (tuition) for two full academic years. This financial incentive is paid after any federal or state grant for which you are eligible is applied. Once you are certified by your high school, you're ready to get started at St. Louis Community College.

To Continue A+ Funding You Must:

- Maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA
- Remain enrolled as a full-time student
- Complete the FAFSA each year
- Visit the Financial Aid office each semester
- Use the benefits within four years of high school graduation

Checklist for new A+ Students

To guarantee funding by the start of classes, complete the steps below before the priority deadlines. Priority dates are June 30 (fall semester); November 30 (spring semester); and April 30 (summer semester).

1) Apply for Admission

- Available at www.stlcc.edu or at the campus Admissions office
- Request your **final** high school transcripts with the A+ stamp be sent to the campus Admissions office

2) Complete the FAFSA – Free Application for Federal Student Aid – using STLCC code 002469

- Available at www.fafsa.ed.gov or call 800-433-3243 to request a paper application

3) Take Accuplacer Assessment

- Math testing is waived with a minimum math score of 23 on the ACT or 580 on the SAT
- Reading and writing testing is waived with a minimum ACT composite score of 21 or SAT critical reading score of 500

4) Meet with an Academic Advisor

- Contact an academic advisor to plan and select courses and get an academic audit

5) Register as a Full-time Student

- You must register for a minimum of 12 credit hours each semester to receive funding for fall and spring terms, six credit hours for summer term
- Enroll online at www.stlcc.edu or visit the campus Registrar's office

6) Visit the Financial Aid Office

- Verify approval/finalize payments
- Check the status of your aid in Banner Self-Service at www.stlcc.edu/selfservice
