Top Chef Adds Spice to Foundation Fundraiser

The St. Louis Community College Foundation hosted its first **Falling in Love...in Four Courses** fundraiser at the Four Seasons Hotel in February 2009. The event featured acclaimed Chef Hubert Keller, who, with assistance from resident chefs at the Four Seasons Hotel and faculty and students from the STLCC Culinary Arts program, prepared an incredible dinner for 120 guests. The premier, community-oriented gala raised more than \$35,000 to benefit STLCC students.



Keller is one of America's most acclaimed chefs, best known for his world-renowned restaurants Fleur de Lys (San Francisco and Las Vegas), Burger Bar (Las Vegas, San Francisco and St. Louis), and SLeek Steakhouse and Ultra Lounge (St. Louis) as well as his cookbooks, appearances on Bravo's Top Chef and his own PBS television show.

More than 20 students were involved in the preparation of the meal over the course of three days. Several of them also were invited to participate in a two-day internship in Chef Keller's kitchen, providing them with valuable experience. Two of the student chefs, one culinary and one pastry, were offered jobs at the Four Seasons Hotel St. Louis based on their performance. Both have graduated from STLCC and are working full time.

"Our students gained invaluable experience by getting involved with Falling in Love... in Four Courses," said Casey Shiller, coordinator of the Baking and Pastry Arts program at Forest Park. "Seeing a banquet of that magnitude come together over the course of a few days allowed our students to practice the skills that they learned in the classroom. The students who participated in the event can proudly call Chef Keller a mentor, and the insight they received from working alongside such a culinary superstar is unsurpassed."

The STLCC Culinary Arts program staff continues to work closely with Chef Keller, providing student assistants to help him prepare for other special events in the area.

I was very happy and appreciative to learn that I was selected as a recipient of your scholarship. By awarding me this, you have lightened my financial burden which allows me to focus more on the most important aspect of school, learning. Your generosity has inspired me to help others and give back to the community college. I hope to one day counsel students and help them achieve their goals just as you have helped me.

AT&T Grant Promotes Retention, METS Preparation

AT&T, Inc. awarded an \$85,000 High School Success grant to the St. Louis Community College Foundation to support its high school retention program and to prepare students for engineering and technology related programs in higher education. STLCC is one of 170 schools and nonprofit organizations nationwide to receive a total of \$12 million in competitive grants from the AT&T Foundation.

The grant will support a group of 60 students from the Hazelwood School District participating in Project Lead the Way curriculum, a program designed to increase students' interest in math, engineering, technology and science (METS) related careers. The program provides enhanced instruction to improve math and reading skills, helping students remain academically on par with their peers.

The grants are part of the company's signature initiative, AT&T Aspire, and helps address high school success and workforce readiness for METS related careers. AT&T has committed \$100 million in philanthropy through 2011 to schools and nonprofit organizations that are focused on high school retention and better preparation for college and the workforce.



"Community members working together can help students succeed – not just in school, but in life – by helping them graduate from high school and gain the skills they'll need to be successful in the workplace," said Dave Nichols, president of AT&T Missouri.

America's Promise Alliance, a non-profit children's advocacy organization, notes that nearly one-third of U.S. high school students drop out before graduating and about 7,000 students drop out every school day, or one every 26 seconds. The Hazelwood School District's dropout rate is less than 5 percent, thanks to its progressive programs.

As one of the largest-ever corporate commitments to high school retention and workforce readiness, the \$100 million AT&T Aspire program will support organizations with strong track records that promote educational success, from the classroom to the workplace. The recipient programs of this year's High School Success grants provide a range of support for students, including academic intervention, mentoring and tutoring services.

With 600 current members, the Meramec Alumni Association is a vital and vibrant component of the Meramec community. Not only does the association raise approximately \$15,000 each year to support student scholarships, it also hosts special events for students, alumni and area residents.

Each year, the association sponsors several fund-raising activities, including a golf tournament, tailgate sale, fashion show, 5K run and trivia night. Proceeds from these events help pay tuition and buy books for deserving students.



“The alumni association is one of the best organizations on this campus. It does so many things for our students and the community,” said Justin Allen. “As president of the Meramec Student Activities Council, I love working closely with the association. The alumni association also gives back to the community with events such as the Senior Prom. Grainger Scholarship Gives Students the Tools to Succeed

W. Grainger Inc., in conjunction with the American Association of Community Colleges, launched the Grainger Tools for Tomorrow scholarship program in 2006 to support students who are seeking an associate degree or certificate level in an industrial trade program. Grainger officials felt that many sectors are in critical need of trained workers who understand modern tools, technologies and processes. The Grainger Tools for Tomorrow Scholarship program aims to develop tomorrow's leaders who will play a critical role in helping to meet a serious and growing skills gap in the United States.



The \$2,000 Grainger Tools for Tomorrow Scholarship is awarded to students who are entering their second and final year in a technical education program. Upon graduation, Grainger recognizes the recipient's achievement with a Westward tool kit designed to fit the needs of their degree program to help them successfully launch their career.

St. Louis Community College students have benefitted from the scholarship since its inception three years ago, as an STLCC student has received one of 35 awards presented each year.

"Though I chose the non-traditional field in auto mechanics, my personality and skills are a perfect match for this field," said Melinda Johnson, a 2008 scholarship recipient. "I am aware it will be difficult; I will have to prove myself, my education will be expensive and getting my first job will be hard. This scholarship has helped meet with my financial needs and the tools will help with my career."

Grainger is expanding the program in 2009-2010 from 35 recipients to 100, with STLCC receiving scholarship funds for two students.

I wanted to thank you for your generosity in helping me and my family with the purchase of my books. We are truly appreciative in how much this will help us. I will do my best in class to make sure you put your money into a worthwhile cause. I will try my hardest to make you proud of the students you help.

New Harrison Education Center to Serve as a Bridge to Opportunity

A new educational center that will provide bridges to opportunities to improve the quality of life for citizens in a very challenged, yet growing St. Louis neighborhood is slated to open for classes in August 2010.

St. Louis Community College officials were joined by state, city and community leaders June 12 in breaking ground for the new William J. Harrison Education Center, at 3140 Cass Avenue in the city's JeffVanderLou Neighborhood. Nearly 200 attended the ceremony.



Located near both Vashon High School and the Clyde C. Miller Academy, the new \$10.5 million facility will be ideally positioned to leverage learning partnerships and provide enhanced educational opportunities for residents of an underserved community.

The current Harrison Center, a space with only two classrooms, has been operating out of the old Julia Davis Library Building on Natural Bridge Road since August 1994. The center was named in honor of the late William J. Harrison, who played a major role in helping the college establish this off-site learning center. He served as associate dean of academic support and continuing education at Forest Park until his death in June 1994. Ironically, the groundbreaking ceremony took place on the day Harrison would have turned 74 years old.

Community "stakeholders" have pledged their support to this effort. The Anheuser-Busch Foundation contributed \$300,000 and alderwoman Marlene Davis has committed \$600,000 for infrastructure improvements surrounding the center. U.S. Rep.

William "Lacy" Clay has secured a \$190,000 appropriation for workforce development and training programs for the center.

The new center will offer credit and non-credit courses in environmental sciences, allied health, computers/technology, and workforce training and development. The 31,000 square-foot facility will feature an art studio, science and computer labs, five classrooms, multi-purpose community room, bookstore, commons area, outreach center and administrative offices.

The center also will be the first "green" public higher education facility of its kind in St. Louis City. It has been designed to achieve Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) gold certification, the second-highest achievable as designated by the U.S. Green Building Council. "Green" elements incorporated into the new facility will include: controllability of lighting and thermal control systems, energy efficient heating and cooling systems, indoor chemical and pollutant source control, and use of recycled materials in the building's construction.

Single Parents Bear Down for Fundraiser, Earn Scholarships

A beary generous donation is helping single parents go to college and potentially bringing clean water to impoverished villages in Africa.

The St. Louis Community College Foundation received a \$5,000 grant from the Build-A-Bear Workshop Foundation to provide scholarships for single parents to participate in a special service learning project initiated by the Forest Park chapter of Phi Theta Kappa, the international honor society for two-year colleges.



For the past two years, the Xi Epsilon chapter has been raising funds to purchase, build and maintain a PlayPump water system through PlayPumps International. This nonprofit organization installs these water systems that provide easy access to clean drinking water, enhance public health and offer play equipment to millions in Africa's sub-Saharan region. PlayPumps are like a merry-go-round or seesaw attached to a water pump that use the energy of children at play to pump clean water to schools and villages in this region.

In November 2008, the New Traditions program joined Xi Epsilon's efforts and cosponsored a trivia night fundraiser, which netted nearly \$3,400. For their efforts in promoting the event, Build-A-Bear scholarships in the amount of \$500 each were awarded to Forest Park students

Karlin Ewing (nursing), Demetrius Stuckey (information systems), LaWanda Smith (business administration/accounting) and Melina Hammon (radiology), and Florissant Valley students Shanese Jackson (biotechnology) and Frankie Young (nursing). All six students are single parents.

The remaining \$2,000 from this grant has been designated as scholarships for four single parents who are pursuing nursing degrees. So far, PTK chapters throughout Missouri have raised approximately \$9,500 toward their goal of \$14,000 to purchase the PlayPump.

The Build-A-Bear Workshop Foundation offers funds to help grant educational stipends intended to diminish poverty levels for children in single parent families through supporting education for low-income adults.

It has been difficult at times but I truly believe that this will instill in my daughter that you can achieve anything in life if you put your mind and heart into it.
