Credit for Prior Learning

What is Credit for Prior Learning?

Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) is a way for students to earn credit for previously acquired knowledge. CPL is commonly referred to as credit by exam or testing out of classes.

CPL is an alternative education or experience-based learning that is gained outside of a college or university. It can include knowledge acquired from work and life experiences, community and volunteer courses, individual study or reading; civic, community, and volunteer work, and participation in informal courses and trainings sponsored by agencies or businesses.

Different colleges apply varying policies on the acceptance of CPL. STLCC cannot guarantee the transferability of prior learning credit that has been awarded.

How do I earn CPL?

Students must meet with an academic advisor or department chair/program coordinator in the same discipline they are seeking CPL to determine which of the following methods are used by the department for a particular course to establish CPL and course exemption. CPL methods include:

- <u>Standardized tests (AP, CLEP, IB)</u>
 - Advanced Placement (AP)

 - College-Level Examination Program (CLEP)

 - Students with IB credit should contact the <u>Assessment Center</u>
- Department exams

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- Students may request to receive credit on the basis of a department exam. Department exams may be written, oral, or performance-based, or some combination thereof.
- Students should discuss this with the appropriate department chair/program coordinator; the department chair/program coordinator can refuse the student permission to test if they feel the student is not prepared.

- Industry credentials
 - Students interested in receiving credit for this type of prior experience should provide a copy of a certificate of completed training, a lesson plan or training content (if available), dates of attendance, proficiency exam scores, and/or other applicable information to the department chair/program coordinator. Demonstration of knowledge may also be required by some departments through department assessments.
 - Credit will only be awarded to training that has been completed within the last 5 years.

- Published guides
 - American Council on Education (ACE) for military training and experience
 - ACE (non-collegiate) for industrial and corporate training programs
 - Other published guides developed by nationally recognized organizations
- <u>Apprenticeship training</u>
 - Apprenticeship training can be transcripted under the guidelines of articulation agreements. Please consult with the department chair to determine if any given apprenticeship training program is covered by an existing articulation agreement.
- Portfolio examination
 - Students may request credit for a course that does not have an established method for granting CPL. In these cases, students should discuss with the appropriate department chair/program coordinator whether the submission of a portfolio will be accepted.
 - The department chair/program coordinator will determine what elements and artifacts should be included in the portfolio.
- Military educational and training credit
 - STLCC awards credit based on the American Council on Education's (ACE) recommendations. Active-duty soldiers or retired veterans are required to submit their Joint Service Transcript (JST) to STLCC if they would like to be awarded CPL for any previous, applicable trainings.

Is there a cost involved?

Under certain conditions, there may be a fee.

- There is no fee associated with posting standardized test scores, industry credentials, military transcripts, apprenticeship training, or other similar learning assessments.
- Assessment of Prior Learning that requires significant attention from a faculty members, such as the direction and evaluation of a portfolio or the assessment of a skills demonstration, may warrant compensation for the faculty member. Faculty will initiate a "Self-Directed Learning" form to receive compensation for their work if this applies.
- The fee for posting credits on the student's transcript for skills demonstration, portfolio review, or other individualized assessment is equivalent to <u>one credit hour of the tuition</u> at STLCC for each course that credit is awarded, based on the residency status of the student.
 - \circ $\;$ The fee is waived in applied music courses.
- The College Board Entrance Exam Board charges a non-negotiable fee as it pertains to CLEP. STLCC charges a \$20.00 fee to proctor CLEP exams for non-students; current students are not charged a fee.

Does CPL meet the residency requirement for graduation?

No. Although CPL is used to fulfill degree/certificate graduation requirements, it may not be applied toward a student's residency requirement.

Will I receive grades for CPL?

Although all work assessed for CPL must meet or exceed "C" level work, letter grades are not assigned. CPL is given the "grade" of "R". "R" grades simply indicate that credit has been awarded. CPL will display on the transcript with the corresponding course and the "R".

When can CPL be awarded?

CPL can be awarded when at least one STLCC credit hour has been successfully completed and transcripted on the student's records.

Will CPL increase my GPA?

No. Since students are not given letter grades for CPL and rather credit, the GPA will not be affected.

Can I appeal a CPL decision?

Yes. Please follow the <u>Standard Appeal Procedure</u>.

List of Currently Accepted AP Tests and Scores

Students who have successfully completed college-level courses in high school may be eligible for credit or placement if they make satisfactory scores on the Advanced Placement Examination sponsored by the College Board. Sponsoring high schools that offer Advanced Placement (AP) classes provide for AP examinations at the end of the course. Students must arrange to have the scores of the AP exams sent from <u>The College Board</u> to STLCC. College credit is granted for students earning a minimum score of three (3) on the exam. There is no fee for posting this credit on a student's transcript.

List of Currently Accepted CLEP Tests and Scores

The College Level Examination Program (CLEP) is designed by The College Board to evaluate college-level learning, no matter how or where the learning took place. STLCC students meeting the minimum passing score may earn the credits and course exemptions. Students interested in taking CLEP exams should meet with an academic advisor to obtain information about testing centers, exam information and registration procedures.

Students who have taken prior CLEP tests at other institutions should arrange to have a copy of the test scores sent directly to the College Registrar from <u>The College Board</u>.

When the exam is similar in content to a course offered by STLCC, credit will be equated to a specific course. When no course equivalent exists at STLCC, credit may be granted as elective hours in the same field as the examination. Students should note that credit will not be given for CLEP exams if the student has existing college credit for the equivalent course.
