Upward Bound**



Upward Bound provides essential support that assists students to prepare for college entrance, retention, and completion. STLCC's Upward Bound Project serves high school students from low-income and/or "first-generation college" families.

Upward Bound students are recruited from schools that have graduation rates that are below the norm for Missouri and the USA. Yet, Upward Bound participants graduate at rates higher than state and national averages. The national Upward Bound annual graduation rate hovers at just above 90%.

This outstanding U.S. Department of Education, TRiO program has been under the management of Forest Park's **Carolyn Jackson** for over 18 years.

STLCC benefitted from two awards from Productive Living Board of St. Louis County. One in support of the vocational enhancement supports for St. Louis County residents with disabilities. The second in support of specialized hardware and software for these students

and the faculty and staff of this ACCESS program under Continuing Education. Assessment and skill development assist students as they strive to reach the next level of success. **Ann Marie Schreiber**, Program Specialist, oversees the program and has been with STLCC for 13 years.

The Employment and Training Administration under the **U.S. Department of Labor** provided the **Trade Adjustment Assistance Community College and Career Training Grants (TAACCCT)** to offer, develop or improve training and education programs to serve workers who were eligible for this training. With a focus on community colleges, the TAACCCT grants were awarded across the nation. STLCC, under the Workforce Solutions Group (WSG) led, or collaborated with other Missouri community colleges, to achieve funding from *four* TAACCCT awards and create career options for our region's workforce.

Expanding Minds and Changing Lives

External funding can make a world of difference for the region. The TAACCCT funding allowed the creation of the Mo WINs portal, encouraging collaboration throughout the state and providing necessary career counseling, orientation, and training options that advance nontraditional learning environments, impacting at-risk and adult learners.

Dianne Lee, Professor with STLCC for 35 years, guided the development of the innovative and recognized Adult Learning Academy (ALA) through the use of TAACCCT grant funding.



The grant scene is dynamic and challenging, with results and financial accountability vital to success in achieving funding. Competition is strong and the funding stream is unpredictable. However, projects are perceived to be active agents of change, reaching out to students and creating partnerships with the community. All agencies request the understanding of research methodologies, asking applicants to achieve their best quantifiable results. The Office of Institutional Development (OID) is here to help a project reach an eligible agency and exhibit its viability - from start to finish.

OID carries the responsibility for college wide coordination and submission of all proposals to external funding sources. When an award is made to the college as a result of a successful proposal, OID will conduct a project orientation meeting for the Project Director and other stakeholders in the grant to assist in starting off right. OID will continue to provide information and maintain the mandated file on the funded project throughout the performance period and the required post-completion file retention requirements.
